





D. Un-black boxing the urbanism

Graham & Marvin 2001

- 1. Participatory methods reveal that urban planning agenda is/was not inert/neutral and "bulletproof".
- Paradox: Within these processes, emerging conflict between public and politicians & officers weakens civic participation's position.
- 3. Severe problems of climate change, crisis of housing remain to be overlooked and unsolved.
