
The Team





- 28 Rangers (in total)
- 10 female Rangers
- 11 Rangers part time employed
- 1 "Digital" Ranger
- Equates to 24 Members (1 Ranger pro 1.042 ha)
- Average in Forest National Parks in Middle Europe (recommended by IUCN): 1 Ranger per 1000 ha


Organization – 5 Ranger Districts

Background

- Daily, 7 days per week
- Summer and winter hours (8,5 7,5 h)
- Patrolling at sunrise and sunset
- Oldest NLP = high variety of themes and experiences
- Timeline of the nature development brings unique natural scenes large amount of "information work"
- Increasing amount of specialist tours
- Not only at nice weather



Ranger Juristiction

- After special Training-Courses (Nature Conservation Academy) the Rangers have the rights and duties of the Police
- The basis are the Forest and Nature Conservation Laws of Bayaria









Offences per year

- More than 40.000 Visitor Contacts
- Approx. 2.800 warnings
- Approx. 160 reports to the police (illegal parking)
- 2020: 250 reports to the police
- 5 to 20 reports to local council for...
 - Illegal hiking & camping
 - fire
 - Garbage

Special information and environmental education




- Junior Ranger camps and trainings


The correct way... the problem with complex topics
